Looking to help a great cause? Abingdon's The Nasio Trust team work to support orphans & vulnerable communities in Kenya. Can you help provide a safe bed for a child?

n 2000, in a small village in western Kenya, the late Irene Mudenyo found an abandoned baby in a sugarcane plantation on her farm. The baby, severely dehydrated and undernourished, needed urgent hospital attention. Irene's attempts to find his family proved futile and, although she was 78, she decided to care for the baby, naming him Moses. After Irene's death Moses was adopted by one of her daughters. Today, he is a healthy 20-year-old.

Two decades later The Nasio Trust, run by Irene's youngest daughter Nancy Mudenyo Hunt (pictured) supports over 400 children, runs two purposebuilt day care centres, a medical centre and provides education programmes. "Our community-based approach is aimed at providing a holistic solution to ending the cycle of poverty," explains Nik Imrie of the charity. "We do this by providing education, improving health, and developing commerce through sustainable income-generating projects."



2021 is a vital year for the charity – its 20th anniversary. This year Nasio's aim is to ensure each sponsored child has access to a toilet and a safe place to sleep. Most children still sleep on the floor due to poverty, which affects health and school attendance. If you'd like to help, easy fundraising ideas include creating a Facebook birthday fundraiser, virtual bake off competitions, or sponsored walks or cycles.
